

CARES Act FINAL Quarterly Report October -December 2020: Jan 5, 2021

Rabbinical College of Long Island has signed and returned the Certification and Agreement and the assurance that the institution has used, or intends to use, no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.

Rabbinical College of Long Island will receive or has received a total of \$85,237 from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.

Rabbinical College of Long Island has disbursed \$85,237 to 131 students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act as of December 15, 2020.

The estimated total number of students at the institution eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 and thus eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act while funds were available is 131.

The method used by Rabbinical College of Long Island to determine which students receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants and how much they would receive is based on the expenses for food, course material, equipment needed to participate in the educational program due to the disruption of campus operations, travel home expenses and health care related expenses. Title IV eligible, dependent students received grants of \$650. One student received an additional grant of \$100 for documented need. All students enrolled are dependents.

Students received the following instructions with their grants: "As per the CARES Act, these grants are to be used for expenses that are related to the disruption of campus operations due to COVID-19, including things like course materials and technology as well as food, housing, health care, and childcare."
